The six-billion-dollar development plan will create twenty-one acres of open, publicly accessible space. The signature truss bridge will have a clear span over the navigable river. It also includes a separated cycle track that will improve bicycle connectivity in the area with a direct link to the 606 multiuse recreational trail. The height and prominence of the truss arch will become a signature component of the development and mark the crossing from a distance. The bridge type recalls other historic truss bridges over the Chicago River but with new state-of-the-art detailing and architectural enhancements. At night, the illuminated bridge will be a beacon for the community.
